Saturday, July 25: 4-H & FFA Horse Show

- Horses to arrive and check-in between 6:30-9:00am and shows will start at 9:00am.

Sunday, July 26: Market Lamb & Breeding Sheep

- Lambs and breeding sheep to arrive and check-in between 7:30-9:30am. Market lamb show will start at 10:00am, with breeding sheep show following.

Monday, July 27: Market Steers & Breeding Heifers/Feeder Calves

- Steers, breeding heifers and feeder calves to arrive and check-in between 7:30-9:30 AM. Market Steer show will begin at 10:00 AM followed by breeding heifer show and feeder calf show.

Tuesday, July 28: Market Goats

- Market goats to arrive and check-in between 7:30-9:30am and the show will begin at 10:00am.

Wednesday, July 29: Market Hogs

- Market hogs to arrive between 6:00-8:00 AM and the show will begin at 8:30 AM.
